AND ANNOUNCES VIRTUAL 2021 RACE FOR THE CURE!**

Decision Prioritizes and Protects Participants' Health and Safety During COVID-19

New Orleans – August 13th 2021 – Susan G. Komen® New Orleans today announced the 2021 New Orleans Race for the Cure will be held virtually, rather than in-person this year due to the Delta variant and surge of COVID-19. Originally planned for October 23th 2021 at City Park, the event will now take place on October 23th 2021 virtually – as a “Race Together as One” virtual event.

“As an organization dedicated to saving lives, it is so important to protect the health of our participants, many of whom are breast cancer survivors or are currently in treatment for the disease. Therefore, we will be leveraging technology again this year to ensure we can “Race Together as ONE” virtually– even if we can’t be together – because breast cancer is not cancelled. We know it’s in the best interest of our community to go virtual until we can get back together again safely.”

“The Race for the Cure serves two important purposes – it is an important fundraiser that fuels Komen’s breast cancer research and patient support efforts, and it provides all those touched by breast cancer a sense of being a part of a large compassionate community committed to making a difference in the fight against breast cancer,” said Lisa Plunkett - Executive Director, Komen New Orleans.
